Clint Gallagher - Principal's Message 2024

2024 has been a remarkable year of achievements for the students and staff of Farrer. Most pleasing were the enormous levels of participation in the widest possible variety of

endeavours. In so many areas, teams and individuals have won state titles or reached a level of success new for our school; the Science and Engineering Challenge, the State Robotic Championships, Public Speaking, Debating, Dubbo Prime Lamb Competition, Rugby Union, Hockey, Athletics, Cross Country, Dance, Drama and many more. The boys have enjoyed trivia nights, dances, camps, the Bush to Beach Lifesaving program, staff v student sporting contests and excursions to all parts of the state, and as far afield as New Zealand. They also experienced their first full year with no mobile phones during the school day showing improved student learning, focus and concentration and has encouraged students to socialise more. We also welcomed our first

Wellbeing Dog, "Dougie", a parting gift given by the class of 2024.

Following our outstanding HSC results of 2023, the 2024 academic year has blossomed with variety and success. William Hamel initially won the Tamworth Region Lion of the Year, and after winning the NSW title travelled to Darwin to compete in the National Competition. Forbes Murdoch represented the school at the UNE

Speaker of Parliament Youth Forum, placing third. Up and coming public speaker Nate Harvey advanced to the state finals and won the local derby. Our Debating teams experienced success with the juniors winning the regional title and Federation Cup, while the intermediate team made it through to the state quarter finals. Our

Robotics team advanced in an incredible manner, competing in the state finals for the first time in 2024 - a wonderful achievement after years of development and improvement.

Hamish Craig's music performance was nominated for inclusion in ENCORE, a HSC Showcase of the best performances across NSW. In addition, Riley Williams (who studied music via Distance Ed while mentored by Rick Mead) was nominated for the Bravissimo Concert, a showcase of the most talented music students in NSW Distance Education, from both public and private schools. A total of fourteen Farrer Year 12 Industrial Technology students

have been nominated for inclusion in SHAPE, which exhibits the best projects in Metal, Wood and Multimedia from around the state. The breadth of student academic achievement in 2024 is truly remarkable.

Charlie Whale and Jacob Martin were honoured with the prestigious NSWCHSSA Blues Award, the highest achievement in school sports across New South Wales public schools.



2024 FARRER HIGHLIGHTS

Charlie Led the North West team to a gold medal at the NSWCHSSA Basketball Championship and earned selection in the NSW All Schools Merit team. Jacob was selected in the NSW All Schools Bowls Team winning Gold at the School Sport Australia Championships securing further selection in the All Australian Bowls Team. These awards celebrate their excellence, sportsmanship, and contributions to their school and sporting communities. Additionally, Teddy Hampton represented NSW at the Australian All Schools Athletics Championships competing in the Under 17 Boys Pole Vault in Brisbane. Teddy jumped an impressive 4.25m, a 15cm PB, to claim the bronze medal. An outstanding achievement.



We continued a long standing tradition by proudly marching together as a school on Anzac Day. Respecting those who have served our nation has been an important part of our school's culture since it opened at the start of the Second World War. This was indeed a highlight of the year and we have been overwhelmed with the positive feedback. A video of the boys marching posted on Facebook was our most popular social media post, with over 400,000 views and hundreds of comments.

The First XI Hockey team won the state title for the second year in succession. This is the first time since the early 1990s that our school has won back-to-back state hockey titles - a tremendous feat. Our First XV won the Waratah Shield for the first time in the history of our school, an outstanding achievement in a closely fought contest. This victory followed our U15 Rugby Union team finishing with a draw in the state final to be crowned dual champions. These major team successes were just one part of a hugely successful year in sport, both individually and in teams, which is evident in the numerous reports in this magazine.



Early in the year the school hosted Mr Murat Dizdar, the Secretary of the NSW Department of Education, who had his first experience milking cows in our award-winning dairy. Murat was impressed with the students he met and the fantastic facilities our students enjoy each day. More broadly, Agriculture has again enjoyed a successful and busy year. Numerous primary schools and preschools have visited our campus to take a hands-on approach to learning under the expert guiding instruction of our staff and students. The Year

10 Sheep Husbandry class enjoyed a most successful prime lamb show, winning more ribbons and prizes than any previous year with Bateson Pittman claiming the 2024 ASA Merino Sheep Young Judge award at the National Finals during October. The annual Ram Sale was a great success, with a 100% clearance and the 22nd Annual Bull Sale successfully achieving a high clearance rate. The school welcomed 1200 people for the biennial Tamworth Agricultural Careers Expo with over 50 exhibitors. This represented our largest and most successful Expo to date.

Congratulations to the outgoing Year 12, who have done an outstanding job in leading the school. Captain Iva Haling and his Vice Captains, Will Hamel and Riley Gentle were exemplary and the whole Year 12 group worked together to achieve much success, raise awareness and funding for charity and promote a positive culture in the school. The Mother and Son dinner and the Father and Son golf day were enjoyed by all, as were the final farewell celebrations at the end of Term 3. It would be remiss not to acknowledge Year Co-ordinator Mrs Kylie Milne who worked tirelessly over the six years to support the boys in their journey.



We have farewelled a number of staff this year. Our farm manager Mr Andrew Eather has made a significant contribution to the school, however, is ready to travel around the country with his lovely wife. We thank Andrew for sharing his expertise on the farm and the friendly manner in which he interacted with students and staff. Our likable chef Mr Raj Rajeev has moved to Brisbane with his family and we thank him for his many hours of work in producing beautiful food for the boys to enjoy. The wonderful Gail Nolan retired this year and received her 30 year service certificate at a school morning tea in term 4. Gail has worked tirelessly in our school office, very much in the background without fuss, and we thank her for her service and wish her the very best in retirement.

I would like to thank the entire staff at Farrer for their immense contributions over 2024. The professionalism and expertise of these people cannot be overstated. We express gratitude to the teaching staff, and to the non-teaching staff; in the office, student support, kitchen, laundry, farm, cleaning, transport, maintenance and grounds. I again thank the School Council for their advice and their scrutiny of policies throughout the year and I look forward to working with this body in 2025. The Farrer PT&F has been ably led by the executive team of Amanda, Jenn and Helen. We thank them for the friendly and welcoming manner meetings have been conducted, and for leading the financial support of numerous projects around the school.







Farrer Makes History with First-Ever Waratah Shield Sept 6th, 2024

A Legacy Sealed in History

For Farrer Memorial Agricultural High School, the 2024 season will forever be etched in the school's rugby legacy. From the Robson Shield to the Waratah Shield, this remarkable journey has showcased the talent, teamwork, and tenacity of the Farrer 1st XV. Their historic win has set a new benchmark and inspired a future generation of athletes who will carry the torch of Farrer rugby into the years ahead.



The Robson Shield Triumph

Thursday, 5th September, saw the Farrer 1st XV follow the victorious U15 Buchan Shield team at Easts Rugby Ground, Rose Bay, ready to face off in the CHS State Rugby Final for the Robson Shield. Within 10 minutes, Terrigal High School scored the first try, slipping past Farrer's defence to take an early lead. However, that was all the spark Farrer needed.

They quickly retaliated with three unanswered tries, taking control of the match and finishing the first half in front. With fierce focus and energy, the team returned for the second half and continued their momentum, adding three more tries in the opening 20 minutes.

While Terrigal managed a late try off an intercepted kick, it was too little too late. Farrer emerged victorious with a decisive 29-10 win, claiming the title of CHS State Champions.

Waratah Shield - Farrer's Journey to Glory

As CHS Champions, Farrer began their Waratah Shield campaign against Redfield College, the Catholic Champions, on Friday, 6th September. Despite playing their second game in two days, Farrer delivered their best first-half performance of the year, dominating to lead 22-0 at halftime.

Fatigue set in during the second half, but a late try from Will Crompton secured a commanding 29-0 victory, earning Farrer a place in the All Schools State Grand Final.

The Final Showdown

The last obstacle between Farrer and history was Central Coast Grammar (CCG), a formidable side that boasted a perfect balance of size, pace, and technical ability. The final, played under scorching conditions, became a physical grind, an intense battle of willpower. Midway through the first half, Farrer found themselves down a player after frustrations boiled over. But in a display of resilience, the remaining 14 players stood their ground, holding CCG scoreless and ending the half at 0-0.

With the team back to full strength, a half-time talk emphasised the need for discipline. Farrer responded by slowly gaining ground, and a brilliant sequence of attacking phases saw Oliver Jordison break through the CCG defence, scoring the matchwinning try. A late turnover by Bailey Scott at the Farrer goal line further thwarted any hopes CCG had of a comeback. As the final whistle blew, Farrer had secured a 5-0 victory and, with it, the prestigious Waratah Shield. This triumph marked the first time in Farrer's history that the team claimed the title of NSW All Schools State Champions, an achievement that will be celebrated for vears to come.

Celebrating First XI CHS Boys **Hockey State Final Champions**

The Farrer First XI Hockey team has made history once again by winning back-to-back CHS titles, a feat not accomplished since the 1990/91 season. In a thrilling final against Model Farms High School, Farrer displayed exceptional skill and determination to secure a hard-fought 3-2 victory in the 2024 championship.

The match was a tense battle, with both teams demonstrating impressive depth and skill. Farrer, although initially nervous, found their rhythm in the second quarter, taking the lead through a wellexecuted team goal from Chris Fox. They extended their advantage with a strong strike from Jack Marshall in the third quarter, heading into the final period with a 2-0 lead.

In the fourth quarter, despite a late rally from Model Farms, Farrer's defence held firm, with standout performances from players like Charlie Stone and Hamish George. After Model Farms pulled one back with a goal from a short corner, Farrer responded with a third goal from Archie Clarke's drag flick. Although Model Farms scored again in the final minutes, Farrer's defence ensured they maintained their lead, ultimately winning 3-2.

This victory not only secured Farrer's position as the top school in the state but also highlighted the strength and unity of the team, marking another remarkable achievement in the school's hockey history.
